

**The minutes of the regular Public Meeting of the Township Council of the Township of Saddle Brook held on March 3, 2016 at 7:00 PM at the Saddle Brook Senior Center, 8 Caldwell Avenue, Saddle Brook, NJ.**

Council President Camilleri called the meeting to order.

Council President Camilleri asked everyone to please rise for the salute to the flag.

Council President Camilleri announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been sent to all Council members by police messenger on February 26, 2016 and to all legal newspapers in accordance with the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975.

The Township Clerk announced that the public is hereby advised that any statements made during the meeting of the Township Council of the Township of Saddle Brook may not be privileged or protected and that persons or entities who take issue with such comments or are offended by same, may, and have in the past, sought legal redress through the courts.

Any member of the public who addresses the Council speaks for themselves and not for the Council.

Mayor White introduced County Clerk John Hogan who presented a poster of historical town documents that were found in the County archives. Mayor White thanked Mr. Hogan for sharing these documents with us.

Mr. Hogan spoke about the history of Bergen County and explained how some of these very old documents were handled and preserved so that they could be shared with the communities where they originated. He also explained the duties and services of the County Clerk's office.

Mr. Hogan then discussed the history of Saddle Brook which began as Saddle River Township in 1716 and was renamed Saddle Brook on November 26, 1955. He gave a brief description of each of the items shown in the posters he presented.

Mayor White said we would proudly display the posters in the Council Chambers. He then invited Mr. Lo Dico to speak.

Mr. Lo Dico said we have minutes that go back to the 1860s and we have Ordinance number one that was introduced and adopted in 1895. Mr. Lo Dico read the text of Ordinance Number One as follows:

The Township Committee of the Township of Saddle River in the County of Bergen does hereby ordain:

Section I. That hereafter a rebate of taxes for township or road programs shall be owed to all owners of wagons and carts used in the Township of Saddle River for the transportation of goods, wares, merchandise, produce, passengers and for general farm, freight and express purposes having tires of not less than four inches in width; said rebate so allowed shall be the sum of 50 cents for each wheel in use in any one year.

Section II. And be it further ordained that this ordinance shall take effect June 1<sup>st</sup> 1895.

Section III. And be it further ordained that this ordinance shall be published five times successively in the Hackensack Republican a newspaper published in the County of Bergen and circulated in the Township of Saddle River.

The foregoing ordinance was duly passed at a meeting of the Township Committee held April 10<sup>th</sup> 1895.

Mr. Lo Dico noted that the last ordinance that we adopted was Ordinance #1606, so since 1895 we have adopted quite a few ordinances. He added, any resident who wants the rebate, please see me tomorrow at Town Hall, I'll be happy to give you the 50 cents if you bring the wagon.

Mr. Lo Dico thanked Clark Printing who prepared the poster as a donation.

Mayor White said Mr. Lo Dico wears a lot of hats in town and most recently as Township Historian which he believed was a very good choice. He may not know about things from the 1700 or 1800s but anything from 1970 on, especially regarding politics, he knows.

Mayor White said the month of March is Women in History Month, and last year we recognized five women. This year we are recognizing four women and one organization.

Mayor White began by introducing Sister Jadwiga Zaremba, the religious education director for St. Philip the Apostle Church. He said she puts her heart and soul into everything she does, but she especially enjoys teaching children. He read a proclamation honoring Sister Jadwiga for her dedication to the Township of Saddle Brook and education services.

Sister Jadwiga spoke briefly and thanked everyone for the honor and said everyone would be in her prayers.

Mayor White said the next recipient was Theresa Greco of Terry's Florist who could not be here this evening. He said she and her late husband Angelo opened their business on Market Street in 1965, and the business has been flourishing ever since. He read a proclamation honoring Mrs. Greco for her dedication to the Township of Saddle Brook and for her outstanding business leadership.

Mayor White said the next recipient continually strives to help others. He introduced Monica Maniscalco, co-founder of Saddle River Angels Soccer Program for children with disabilities and director of God's Special Children for religious education out of St. Philip's Church. He read a proclamation honoring Mrs. Maniscalco for her dedication to the Township of Saddle Brook and her outstanding citizenship.

Mrs. Maniscalco spoke briefly and thanked her friends and family for their support and strength and said her proudest moments are when parents come to her and say her programs have helped their children.

Mayor White said the next recipient was the Saddle Brook Women's Club, a non-profit organization that focuses on helping women and children. They donate to several charities and donate many hours to Township functions and assist our Projects and Activities committee. He read a proclamation honoring them for their dedication to the Township of Saddle Brook and outstanding civic service.

Mayor White said the next recipient was Joann Brendel who exemplified what it means to be a volunteer. He said you can always count on her to help whenever the Township needs her, and she donates so much of her time to community service. He spoke briefly about Ms. Brendel's work with various Township organizations and her photography skills. He then read a proclamation honoring Ms. Brendel for her dedication to the Township of Saddle Brook and her outstanding civic service.

Ms. Brendel thanked everyone and mentioned many of the organizations she works with to provide service to the town.

Council President Camilleri then asked Councilwoman D'Arminio to read CR# 316-82 recognizing Women's History Month and congratulating the honorees for their service to the community.

Mr. Ryan Roy of 167 North Leswing Avenue congratulated all the honorees and spoke about Sister Jadwiga's dedication to helping children through her program. He also thanked Ms. Brendel for her photography and all the things she does for the town. He mentioned Access for All and his work with that committee.

Ms. Joanne Montenegro introduced herself as Director of Sales and Marketing at the new Crowne Plaza. She introduced the hotel's Catering Manager and thanked Council President Camilleri for inviting them to the meeting this evening. She said they were extremely excited about the hotel being open very soon, and they were more excited to join in on Saddle Brook's anniversary. She congratulated everyone and said they would be part of everything that happens here in Saddle Brook.

Ms. Montenegro said they were thrilled to have the hotel open in the next couple of weeks. She said there will be no club upstairs, but it will be a beautiful restaurant and lounge and said there are 148 guest rooms, 6500 square feet of meeting space, and everything in the hotel is brand new. She mentioned their work-out space, ample parking, and breakfast in the lobby. She invited anyone to ask her any questions they might have about the hotel.

Mr. Roy asked if there would be a view of the New York skyline. Ms. Montenegro said yes, there is a panoramic view from the 12<sup>th</sup> floor. Mr. Roy asked about hosting private events there, and Ms. Montenegro said yes, that was possible. She said her endeavor tonight was to let everyone know the hotel would be open shortly and to meet everyone. She invited everyone to come and see the hotel.

Hearing no one, Council President Camilleri asked for a motion to close the meeting to the public.

## **Mayor and Council Comments**

Mayor White said he had submitted the budget to the Council at Tuesday's work session. He thanked Mr. Lo Dico, Mr. Carnevale and the auditor Mr. Weilkotz who worked very hard together. He noted there would be a budget meeting on Wednesday, March 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM at Town Hall and at that time we should be making recommendations to the Council to take action for a digital sign which was proposed a while ago. Hopefully we will have that to vote on on the 16<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor White said the salt shed is just about complete, the only thing we are waiting on is the overhead door, and today was the first delivery of salt to the shed.

He noted we received the allocation toward the DPW garage, Engine Co. No. 2 and Hook and Ladder have all been approved under the direct install grant program so we are receiving about \$30,000 for the DPW, \$17,350 for Engine Co. No. 2 and \$12,380 for Hook and Ladder. Also we are getting a reimbursement from Passaic Valley Sewer Commission of \$20,500 for an overpayment. We have already received a \$4500 rebate for connection fees, so we're going to gain \$25,000 in that regard.

Mayor White said they had a sewer liaison meeting on February 22<sup>nd</sup> attended by Councilman Accomando and Mr. Lo Dico. The 300<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee meeting was on Tuesday February 23<sup>rd</sup>, and a Mayor's Youth Group meeting on February 27<sup>th</sup>. He said they had an Access for all Meeting last night, and Councilman Cimiluca would speak on that.

Mayor White said he was looking forward to meeting with the Bergen County Shared Services Coordinator on March 8<sup>th</sup>, and they were hoping to do some projects related to flood mediation and drainage improvements with them and some surrounding towns. On March 7<sup>th</sup> there will be an AARP meeting at the Senior Center. Representatives from Bergen County Housing and Development will be there to discuss senior housing. Councilwoman D'Arminio would discuss that.

Mayor White announced the 300<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Pancake breakfast would be Saturday March 19<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 to 11:00 AM at the Dynasty Buffet; tickets are \$5.00/\$7.00 at the door. Tickets are going very fast.

He said the Annual Easter celebration would also be held on March 19<sup>th</sup> from 12:00 noon to 2:00 PM at Saddle Brook High School gymnasium. The Ambulance Corps Fish and Chips Dinner will be held Friday, March 25<sup>th</sup> from 5:00 to 8:00 PM at the Ambulance Corps building, tickets are \$12.00.

Lastly, he noted there would be a 300<sup>th</sup> Anniversary dedication service at the First Reformed Church on Saturday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>. He congratulated all the honorees for Women in History and thanked Bergen County Clerk John Hogan and his staff for the posters we are going to display in the Council Chambers. He concluded by wishing everyone a Happy Easter.

Councilman Accomando spoke about the Board of Education liaison meeting in which they discussed taping their meetings and putting lightning detectors on the schools and the fields. He mentioned moving some of the summer programs from the Board of Ed into the rec program. He noted that the Fire Department Engine 1 is having a bus trip to Atlantic City on April 10<sup>th</sup> for \$30.00 a ticket, leaving at 10:00 AM from the fire house. He discussed basketball, and said he thought this was the best year he had ever seen. He congratulated Manny Scarangelo and Diane Bonner and the coaches for the transition and for the time they put in. He added it was a great program and concluded by wishing everyone a Happy St. Patrick's Day and Happy Easter.

Councilwoman D'Arminio congratulated all the recipients of the Women In history recognition and noted Monday March 7<sup>th</sup> is Saddle Brook AARP Chapter 3785's meeting. She repeated that they would be hosting representatives from the Bergen County Housing authority regarding Senior Housing on Caldwell Avenue. They will explain the update on where they are at with that, and they will take any questions that we have. Non-members are welcome, and if anybody would like join she would love to have them.

She said she would be attending a meeting at Bergen County Community Development on March 9<sup>th</sup> to request grants for this year. Last year we received \$67,000 to start Phase II of the sixth district drainage project, and we also received money for the senior center. This year we are going out for three grants for Phase II of the 6<sup>th</sup> district drainage, for a grant to the barrier free restroom facilities at Veterans' Field and also additional funding for the senior center. We have another

flood meeting planned, and we are trying to get the date together between the County and the Freeholders, and it was expected to be at the end of the month. The date would be published in the newspaper, TV and on social media.

She said they planned to discuss the flood insurance ratings program at that meeting and explained that the township has to meet certain criteria. For each criteria that you meet, you get a percentage off. Although we can't do anything immediately with the river, by starting this program it will give immediate relief to the residents and businesses who pay flood insurance. That will be announced as soon as we have the confirmed date.

Councilwoman D'Arminio said the annual Easter Egg hunt will be March 19<sup>th</sup> from 12:00 to 2:00 at Saddle Brook High School. She thanked Wal\*Mart for sponsoring it again this year as they did last year. She wished everyone a Happy St. Patrick's Day and St. Joseph's Day and Happy Easter.

Councilwoman Mazzer congratulated all of the Women in History honorees and thanked them for their service. She said she was appointed chairperson of the park that we are going to have dedicated for our Tricentennial, which will be on the corner of Platt and Saddle River Road. She said the contractor there said he will be more than happy to provide us with whatever we need to see this project through.

Councilwoman Mazzer said we are asking our professionals to get going with plans for our concession stand and bathrooms at Veterans' Field. We need that project to be done yesterday. We will be on top of them to make sure that gets done in a timely fashion. She wished everyone a Happy Easter and Passover.

Councilman Cimiluca congratulated the recipients of the Women in History Awards this evening.

He said he was glad the signs on Erie and Lyster have been erected and discussed the traffic issues there. He said he would be happy to make a motion to approve the mobile sign at the budget meeting. It will be another way to get information out.

He said at the work session he brought up an issue, and he was very disappointed in what he heard. He said we were under the impression that Midland Avenue and Saddle River Road and part of Market Street were going to be paved as part of the program for the County because they are all county roads, and what we had to do was pay for it and install barrier free curb cuts and ramps on all the intersections before they would do the paving. What happened is, we paid for it, the engineer hired a contractor; they're done. Then they pave, and we get reimbursed for all that. What I was kind of upset to hear was that apparently that well has run dry, and there is no longer the funds in there to pay for all that.

Councilman Cimiluca said he had a meeting with Freeholder DiNicola and asked about it. Mr. Tom Connelly is director of roads, and he advised he would be in contact to discuss this issue. Councilman Cimiluca said we have to push it because we have at least three county roads going through our town, and they have to be fixed.

Regarding Veterans' Field he said we don't have plans yet, but we are working on it. Our goal is to have the snack stand and restrooms ready for the fall season of football. That's really what we want to do, and it should be there. We are trying to speed up the process.

He mentioned recreation and said he was happy to hear from the mayor that there is money in the budget proposed that we can potentially have a full time recreation director. There is money being put in the budget. We're already into March, so it would be half the proposed salary that's put in the budget for that position. We have to figure out what that person would do and what they would be paid, but there is money in that budget. He said he appreciated everything that every recreation commissioner has ever done for us. It's a ridiculously hard amount of work and a ridiculous amount of time that they spend. He reiterated that he felt a full time recreation director is warranted.

He said he is honored to have been chosen to chair the Access for All Committee. Freeholder DiNicola was in attendance at their first meeting, and they would be meeting on the first Wednesday of every month. We already have some ideas to give everyone equal access to all things in Saddle Brook. He mentioned the lack of a sign designating handicapped parking and also noted that the area designated with blue stripped lines next to a handicapped space is for the ramp of a handicapped modified vehicle. He asked that the DPW might repaint the lines as they are very faint.

He said next month they would invite Joe Obiso, the town webmaster, to the meeting, and many towns have websites that have a lot of information on disability services.

Councilman Cimiluca read a portion of an article regarding the death of a young person from drug abuse and mentioned the website <http://www.co.bergen.nj.us> for Addiction Services. He mentioned an interactive awareness event to be held on March 22<sup>nd</sup> at Indian Hills High School run by the County for parents, caretakers, educators and community members. Anyone who has a child they think may be involved with drugs are urged to attend.

Councilman Camilleri thanked Bergen County Clerk John Hogan for his presentations and congratulated the honorees for Women in History Month. He discussed how much sports in the community do for children, and he mentioned the Saddle Brook High School Wrestling team and said they had an historic year. He thanked all the wrestlers and coaches involved with the program. He mentioned having heard great things about girls' basketball and congratulated them as well. He wished everyone a Happy St. Patrick's Day and Happy Easter.

Councilwoman Mazzer congratulated the cheerleaders for their placement at nationals this year.

Councilman Cimiluca mentioned UNICO and that Bingo would be held at the America Legion.



The Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission (“PVSC”) recently became aware of an issue relative to its calculation of municipal user charges for the period 2011 through 2015. In short, due to a data entry error that occurred when the Township of North Bergen was incorporated into the PVSC system in October 2010, North Bergen was undercharged and PVSC’s other contributing municipalities collectively overpaid user charges in the same amount as North Bergen’s underpayment over the period 2011 through 2015. As outlined in the enclosed spreadsheet, the amount of the overpayment by your municipality to PVSC is \$20,551.15.

On behalf of PVSC’s newly-constituted Board of Commissioners, please know that PVSC sincerely regrets and accepts full responsibility for this error. Rest assured that the Board of Commissioners is committed to reimbursing all of PVSC’s contributing municipalities in short order. To that end, the Board will consider a resolution authorizing a payment to your municipality in the above amount at its March 10, 2016, Public Meeting.

**Background**

On March 9, 2006, PVSC entered into an agreement with the Township of North Bergen and the North Bergen Municipal Utilities Authority (collectively, “North Bergen”) pursuant to which PVSC agreed to accept and treat North Bergen’s wastewater. Thereafter, PVSC began to treat North Bergen’s wastewater on October 6, 2010.

PVSC allocates non-direct (residential and light commercial) municipal user charges based on a five-year rolling average and a flow measurement year that runs from October 1<sup>st</sup> through September 30<sup>th</sup>. The calendar year 2011 municipal user charges calculated by PVSC were based on the average flow of measurement years 2006 through 2010. As North Bergen did not send its sewage to PVSC for treatment during measurement years 2006 through 2010, PVSC had to input

North Bergen's historical flows for those years into its User Charge computer program in order to simulate a five-year average for North Bergen. Although PVSC staff was able to enter the North Bergen historical flow data for measurement years 2006 through 2009, a computer system data integrity control prevented staff from inputting data for measurement year 2010 since measurement year 2010 was ongoing at that time. Thus, PVSC staff forwarded the data to its computer support consultant and requested that the consultant input the data after the close of the measurement year. Unfortunately, the consultant did not input the data as directed, an error for which PVSC accepts full responsibility.

As a result, beginning in calendar year 2011 and continuing through calendar year 2015, North Bergen's non-direct user charges were calculated based on a five-year average with only four measurement years of data. The error did not become apparent until PVSC calculated the calendar year 2016 user charges (based on measurement years 2011 through 2015), at which time measurement year 2010 data was no longer being used in the five-year average. This resulted in an apparent spike in North Bergen's user charges in 2016 as compared to 2015, which prompted a detailed analytical review of all user charge billings and, in turn, ultimately revealed the fact of the missing measurement year 2010 data.

### **Remedy**

PVSC's first priority is to reimburse all of its contributing municipalities for user charge overpayments over the period 2011 through 2015. A resolution authorizing the reimbursement of the pertinent amounts will be considered at the Board of Commissioners' March 10, 2016, Public Meeting. We anticipate that all payments will be issued that day upon approval by the Board.

Please be assured that PVSC has exhaustively reviewed and verified its system data to ensure that user charge invoices for 2016 were accurately prepared. Furthermore, PVSC intends to retain a computer consultant to evaluate and install additional system safeguards in PVSC's User Charge computer program to flag any data entry errors going forward and prevent a similar issue in the future. Finally, PVSC has begun to explore the next generation computer system that will eventually replace PVSC's legacy software program.

Mayor White asked Mr. Lo Dico to elaborate on curb cuts and paving on Midland Avenue. He said Councilman Cimiluca said there was no more funding there, but the way he understood it there was no more funding left in 2015, but there will be additional funds in 2016.

Mr. Lo Dico said when we became aware of the program, the County roads are maintained by the County of Bergen. When paving is done, the Township is responsible for putting in the curb cuts as we have done in the past, but there are different standards today and they have to be redone and the County would reimburse us. As of last year, probably near the end of their fiscal year, the engineer had contacted the county because the plans are ready for the ADA cuts to be done and he was told they can’t be done at this point in time because the county did not have funding to reimburse us. So we will follow up on that and see

with the new fiscal year that started in January as we did, additional funding might be available at this time.

Mayor White asked Mr. Lemanowicz to give an update of what's going on with the Veterans' Field Concession stand and bathrooms.

Mr. Lemanowicz said we received all the information that is needed, and we had a conversation today with the architect. We have respectfully requested that they work over the weekend to get the plans done so that we can make a submission hopefully next Friday. I'm not promising anything, but that is our target at this point.

Councilman Camilleri said he had the opportunity to see what has been accomplished at the DPW. The roof is complete, it's nice. They did a really good job on the salt shed. Now we become independent. We don't have to rely on storing our salt in Maywood. We will be able to keep more tabs on what's going in and out, and I think that's a good thing for our community.

Council President Camilleri asked for a motion to adjourn.
