300th Anniversary of Saddle Brook

Saddle Brook was established in 1716 making us 300 years old this year!



300th Township Anniversary

Saddle Brook has a remarkable history, spanning from its rural farmland beginnings to the thriving suburban community it is today. The 300th Anniversary will be a wonderful opportunity to celebrate, reflect and showcase the various aspects and history of our town. The Township has created a planning committee whose mission is to create a memorable and meaningful celebration this year and unite the residents in instilling a sense of pride in the community. Some of the events planned, include:

- Special Council Meeting Presentations
- Historic presentation from Bergen County Clerk John Hogan
- Establishment and dedication of Township Tri-Centennial Park
- Recognition Presentations
- Community Socials
- Memorial Day Parade Float

Pole banners will also be hung throughout the township highlighting and commemorating this anniversary through October. These banners are sponsored by local businesses and interested parties. The township will also create a commemorative photo journal depicting various photographs of historical development of the township.







Budget

Mayor White and the Township Council are constantly working to ensure that resident tax dollars are put to good use and to increase efficiency of township investments. Highlights of the 2015-2016 budget include the hiring of additional police officers, a maintenance person for all township buildings, salary increases and replacement of retiring personnel from the Department of Public Works and the tax office. It also includes funding for a grant writer to assist in aggressively pursuing grants for the township, and providing funding for the municipal court to recoup unpaid fines or tickets. This would also cover starting a capital improvements program to upgrade our water and sewer systems, road resurfacing and vital equipment for our fire department.

The budget also includes bond funding for improvements to William Street, which are imperative for the Township, as well as having an emergency generator for the municipal building, and improving the sewer and drainage systems. In order to fund these projects, the Township issued bonds to finance part of the cost of these aforementioned projects. In conjunction with grants such as a FEMA Grant worth \$75,000 and a Community Development Block Grant worth \$60,873, bonding will help modernize Saddle Brook's infrastructure and the township in general.

Shared Services Meeting

During times of financial constraint, it is important that township funds are used frugally and wisely. The Mayor and Town Council constantly strive to find creative ways to save money and work in an efficient manner to serve residents. One of these solutions has been to pool and share resources with other municipalities within Bergen County to accomplish the same services.

In facilitating this goal, representatives from eight municipalities, including the Bergen County Department of Public Works and the Deputy Chief of Staff for Bergen County Executive James Tedesco met in Lodi to discuss sharing services.

The group plans to meet on a monthly basis to get the program up and running.

- The group discussed the possibility of sharing equipment and servicing equipment through the County Department of Public Works.
- The goal is for towns to form a network to pool equipment with the county acting as a central station to facilitate the process.

Public Service Gas & Electric (PSE&G) Energy Efficient Grant

The Township is constantly working to find ways to save money for general expenses, such as energy usage. A great way to accomplish this is through grants, which the Township researches and applies for frequently.

One of the grants that the Township has recently applied for is the PSE&G Energy Efficient Grant, which provides eligible candidates with a free on-site energy audit and a proposal that lists the costs to install energy efficiency improvements recommended in the audit.

These improvements typically include:

- New lighting
- Heating and Air Conditioning upgrades

PSE&G has conducted audits of all township buildings and Saddle Brook has been approved for this grant. The Township will use this grant for lighting at the Department of Public Works garage and two firehouses.

Promotions in the Ranks

Keeping the Township safe and crime-free is one of the Mayor and Town Council's top priorities. In order to accomplish this, Saddle Brook has one of the best police departments throughout the state, in which emphasis is placed upon training and institutional experience.

In making sure the Saddle Brook Police Department has leaders who have had many years of training in policing, Mayor White had the honor of administering oaths of office and promoting well-deserving and qualified police officials at a special swearing-in ceremony in town hall. Thomas Johnson was promoted to Police Lieutenant and Jeffrey Panagia was promoted to Police Sergeant. Lt. Johnson is a 20-year veteran of the police department and has served in both the Patrol Division and the Detective Bureau. Sergeant Panagia is a 22-year veteran of the police department assigned to the Patrol Division. Earlier in the day, Douglas Habermann and David DeGennaro were reinstated to the rank of Sergeant, promotions they received in December 2014. Congratulations and best wishes to the promoted officers and their families!

New Officers Join the Saddle Brook Police Department

The Saddle Brook Police Department is constantly patrolling our neighborhoods, schools and township to keep all of us safe. This is why making sure that the police department is fully staffed and vigilant is so important.

To accomplish this, Mayor White appointed three new police officers during a swearing- in ceremony in the summer of 2015. The new officers, Joseph Scrafani, Peter Romero, and Timothy Parisi are all Saddle Brook residents. They were also the top three candidates on the Civil Service Commission eligibility list, bringing the total number of police officers in our department to 31. The three officers completed the 115th police recruit class at the Bergen County Law & Public Safety Institute. Congratulations to these police officers, we are proud of them!

Re-establishment of School Resource Officer

With the additional manpower allocated to the police department, we will re-establish the school resource officer program. The officer will be assigned to all township public schools to interact and act as a liaison between the school environment and police department. This program has proven to be successful in developing a positive proactive relationship with youth in the community.

Police Worn Body Cameras

Transparency and accountability have always been cornerstones in Saddle Brook's police department. While the Saddle Brook Police Department truly is exceptional in their mission to protect and serve the Township, body cameras will provide an extra layer of transparency for officers and residents. Body cameras will also highlight the hard and great work that our police officers do day in and day out. As part of a grant through the New Jersey Attorney General's Office for police departments across the state, the Saddle Brook Police Department was approved for 15 body cameras. This initiative places Saddle Brook as a leader in police-community relations and transparency.

Recreation, Parks, & the Mayor's Youth Group

The Recreation Department was successful in increasing facility locations, to better accommodate practice and game schedules for our sports teams.

Did you know that Saddle Brook has a youth group? If your child is in the fourth through twelfth grades, then he or she would be eligible for the Mayor's Youth Group.

Mayor's Youth Group

Mayor White's Youth Group provides an opportunity for the township's youth to get involved and learn about their local government. Participants develop stronger leadership skills and truly get to make a difference in the

community. They also work closely with elected officials and other community leaders in the Township to make their neighborhoods better.



Pond Clean Up

The Saddle Brook Youth Group participated in a Pond Clean Up in June. Working together as a team, they were able to remove several bags of litter from the pond and surrounding areas. They also had fun learning about the environment and kayaking. Thank you to the Saddle Brook Youth Group, parents, and Council members for their help in keeping our waterways clean! Mayor White looks forward to having more community service events in the future.

Kiwanis Club Fishing Derby

The Kiwanis Club did a great job of planning, organizing and running the Kiwanis Fishing Derby in Saddle River County Park. Contestants caught Carp, Sunnies and Smallmouth Bass. Anglers reported seeing large Snapping Turtles swimming in the pond and Painted Turtles sunning themselves on logs in the water. Special Projects and Activities

The Township hosts special events throughout the year. They include our Easter Celebration, Fishing Derby, Fourth of July Fireworks

In addition to these events, members of the Mayor's Youth Group, Mayor White and members of the Township Council tour the town to judge the homes that registered for the Halloween Decorating Contest and Holiday Decorating Contest. DPW/Road Improvements

Potholes and Road Improvements

The Department of Public Works has begun an aggressive pothole repair plan with crews working to fill numerous potholes on local streets. The budget calls for capital improvements, which would fund the implementation of a road improvement program. This includes resurfacing many of the township's aging roads, as well as improving storm drainage and other infrastructure.

For potholes on County roadways, the Township is working closely with the Bergen County Director of Public Works and the Bergen County Roads Department to ensure these roads are fixed as quickly as possible. The County has doubled crews working during the week, as well as staff working overtime shifts on Saturdays.

Road Program

The Department of Public Works and Town Engineer have identified a number of streets that have been identified as being most in need of repair and considered a top priority. This road project will be funded as a capital improvement allocated through the bonding process. The Township is committed to reestablishing an annual road improvement program.

Department of Public Works (DPW) Roof

As part of the Township's efforts to maintain its infrastructure, the Department of Public Works Roof was an important project.

This project originally went out to a competitive bid and the contractor with the lowest bid was awarded the contract to complete the project. The roof is now complete approximately \$5,000 under budget.

Department of Public Works (DPW) Salt Shed

The Township has been sharing Maywood's salt shed while Saddle Brook's own shed was being built. It is important that the Township be able to independently provide services for residents in times such as major snowstorms, that is why the Saddle Brook Salt Shed was a necessity.

The Township Council has been managing this necessary infrastructure with responsible spending, and originally rebidding the salt shed project twice and needing more time to consider other alternatives before making a decision to proceed. After careful consideration, the council was able to award a contract and the salt shed was just recently completed.

The Township is committed to senior services and wants to ensure that the needs of senior citizens are being met. From time to time, the township plans entertaining events for senior citizens to take part in. One of the fun events that took place in October for senior citizens was Chicken Bingo.

This event is held three times a year at the Senior Center.


Senior Halloween Party
