UPDATE ON SPECIAL PROJECTS

County Curb Ramps

This work is complete and we are currently closing out the project. Our township engineer will assist us in applying for reimbursement from Bergen County. A call to Bergen County Executive's Office found that the paving money for this project is linked to the N.J. Transportation Trust Funds, which continues to be under a stop work order.

Veterans Field Bathrooms and Concession Stand

This work is underway. The foundation is in and utility connections are proceeding.

2015 Water and Roadway Improvements

The 9th Street portion of this project is stopped until further notice pending the water test results in this area of the township. We are currently working on addressing a reported sanitary clog issue on 9th Street with the homeowner. Curb, milling and paving will follow after this has been resolved. The Wilson/3rd Street portion is set to begin in the coming weeks.

North Fifth Street Water Main

This project is underway. We have addressed complaints from the one resident on 5th Street. There was also an issue with respect to the removal of some contaminated material under the roadway at the former Amloid site. The township engineer will be issuing a detailed report regarding this issue.

Municipal Building Generator

A project walk-through took place with the contractor and the ambulance corps for coordination purposes. The contractor is working on applying for permits and submitting shop drawings for review so we may begin construction.

Fifth Street Drainage

The project is underway and is expected to be completed sometime in the third week of September.

Mayhill Pump Station Flow Gate

This work is complete. The contractor has provided pricing on the replacement of the bar screen at the pump station which is currently under review.

Drainage Improvements/Liberty Street

The field survey for this work is complete, as well as a test pit to fully identify the issue behind a severely back-pitched drainage pipe. Design is being finalized and the plans are to be sent to CDBG next week so that we may request bids to complete the work.

Jefferson St. & Fourth St. Water & Roadway Improvements

The developer of a residential subdivision has started work. Following clearing, the developer will install the new water system and test the pressure/flow. The test results will determine if the developer will be required to replace a portion of the water main on Jefferson Street. Following this determination, the township's project plans will be revised accordingly and the project will be bid. Our township engineer continues to work with the applicant to verify compliance with state regulations with respect to the new storm water discharge into the railroad ditch.

RECREATION

Full Time Recreation Director

Andrew Gallo was hired as our township's first full-time recreation director. He started his new position on September 6th. Andrew is a lifelong Saddle Brook resident, a member of our Volunteer Fire Department and is an assistant coach for Saddle Brook High School's girls soccer team.

Several candidates applied for the position and Andrew was found to be the most qualified of the group. He has the required level of education, a background managing employees and experience working with children as a recreation leader and coach. Andrew is a graduate of Saddle Brook High School and previously worked as a special education aide at the Children's Institute in Livingston. Prior to that he was a plant operations director at the Maywood Center for Health and Rehabilitation.

The recreation director position was created by the governing body in an effort to improve and expand the services of the recreation department. Joseph Setticase, who has been our part-time recreation director, will remain employed until the end of 2016.

As our full-time recreation director, Andrew will be tasked with planning, developing, promoting and overseeing all recreation programs and activities. This includes establishing schedules and methods of providing services, developing standards, policies and procedures, providing guidelines and instruction to each sport commissioner on mandatory guidelines and safety practices; monitoring the functions of each sport and their leaders to ensure efficiency; identifying the needs of programs, facilities and resources to ensure objectives are met; and providing input into the development of budgets and approving and monitoring expenditures.

OTHER

Community Rating System

I had contacted the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to express interest in participating in a program called the Community Rating System. On September 7, 2016, Business Administrator Peter Lo Dico and I met with James Watt, a representative from the Environmental Protection Agency to discuss the Community Rating System and the township's obligations once enrolled in the program. By taking part in this program, the township will conduct floodplain management activities that exceed minimum standards thereby reducing the cost of flood insurance for our residents required to pay this additional premium. Peter Lo Dico has been appointed as our Community Rating System Coordinator and he is currently getting assistance from the Bergen County Office of Emergency Management and Bergen County Shared Services.
