



Councilman Cimiluca said he thought the opinion that was given to him was after whatever that was, two years ago, whenever that motion, whenever that ordinance was put in place.

Ms. Zottarelli thanked Councilman Cimiluca.

Hearing no one else, Council President Mazzer asked for a motion to close the meeting to the public.

## **COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Council President Mazzer asked Mr. Perry DiPiazza to answer questions regarding Veterans' Field. She said Mr. Costa was here also to address any concerns.

Councilman Cimiluca suggested Councilman Camilleri could report back so Mr. DiPiazza will know what was said at the meeting last Friday.

Councilman Camilleri said there were a lot of things they discussed with the field turf itself: the lining, dimensions, coloring. He said the drawings look correct. We just have two decisions to make with the SB or the Falcons in the middle of the field or the SB in the corner and the Falcons in the corner. The dimensions look good. He said he had a request with soccer regarding the color of the lines. They are looking for red or blue rather than yellow and they also asked for two short fields or half field, and they were not on there.

Mr. Costa said they were not on there. They contacted Field Turf, and they're recommendation was not to do that. We can put little squares in the corner, then we can put cones. If you start doing fields in the opposite direction – there are so many lines on the field now, it might get confusing. That was their recommendation, but it's certainly up to the Council to make a decision.

Councilman Camilleri said if we have the drawing, it's one thing to say it, if it is confusing. He said he agreed. If we had it on the drawing, we could visually look at it. He suggested working that up so we can visually see what it is.

Mr. DiPiazza said for soccer there are all different field sizes for the different age groups. It's more a matter of fitting it into the field as to what size it is. There really is not going to be any specific regulation size. He said they could put it in the way they think it should go.

Councilman Camilleri said he was in agreement that there were a lot of lines on the field, but reiterated it would help to see it on paper. Mr. DiPiazza said they could revise the drawing in the morning and send it to Mr. Lo Dico.

Discussion continued on the placement and size of the other soccer fields. Mr. Costa said the coloring needed to be determined, and Mr. DiPiazza needed to get the final drawing to the Council for them to sign off and get it in production. Councilman Camilleri said he didn't want the Council or Mayor to hold the project up; it seems to be rolling along and the weather is not looking all that bad, so he wanted to keep it on track. He said this was a big issue.

Mr. Costa said if we don't get too much bad weather, by Wednesday or Thursday of next week all of the curbing will be in, all the walls will be complete, and early the following week the rest of the drainage underneath the field and the stone. He

predicted they would be ready for turf in two weeks, but the manufacturing might take at least three weeks.

Mr. DiPiazza said this is a good time of year to get this done. They just wanted the Council to commit to what the field was going to look like with markings. He said they would get that done right away, and if the weather continues to cooperate they would get in and get the field in.

Councilman Camilleri addressed the concern of the cancer-causing element. He mentioned studies and asked Mr. DiPiazza to comment. Councilman Cimiluca mentioned the soccer goalies. Mr. DiPiazza said he has been working with Field Turf for 18 years. There are over 500 Field Turf fields here, [Saddle Brook] is surrounded by them, and they have been in use here in New Jersey for about 17 years. The oldest fields are 18 years or so. He explained the use of recycled tire rubber has been in use for maybe 40 years in different applications and for the last 20 years or so in turf fields. There has been close to 800 governmental studies that have been performed on the use of granulated tire rubber for these types of applications. There is not one study that comes back to say that it's bad for the environment or bad for anybody using these materials in these applications. It would be no different than you taking this table here and burning it and inhaling it. There are some bad things that would come off of that. The same thing will happen with tire rubber. There are a lot of different components that the tires are made of.

Mr. DiPiazza said the natural grass business funds a lot of the negative press towards the use of materials or synthetic turf fields in general because synthetic turf fields have become somewhat of a threat to the natural grass industry. You eliminate the need for water, all the irrigation, all the pumping equipment, chemicals and pesticides and lawn care that goes into it. It's a big business compared to the turf business. Buying a synthetic turf field and using it for municipal use or school use takes the place of three to four natural grass fields. If you Google something, you will come up with all sorts of crazy things that were done where they introduced acid to tire rubber and examined what was leaching out of that. It's bad, it's not good. It's no different than if you burned the carpet in here. That's where a lot of that negative press comes from.

Mr. DiPiazza added that in Europe where they are real purists with the environment, everybody uses tire rubber. There was a point that Italy actually banned the use of these type of materials, and it wasn't because they were dangerous to human beings. It was because when the field went through its useful life these materials were put in landfills and these landfills burned. It was about the environment, not about human beings getting sick from these materials.

Mr. DiPiazza continued to discuss the reasons why people object to using turf fields. He concluded that particular story seemed to be an unfortunate coincidence that there happened to be some female soccer goalies who came down with the same type of cancer and concluded that there has been no link to any type of cancer and added the use of these materials is also environmentally friendly.

Mr. DiPiazza noted there was a booklet that gives the conclusion to a lot of these studies and suggested the Council read through it. He said there are fields that have been used over and over, and you will hear nothing but positive things from the users of them. You will not hear anything negative about cancer or the ill effects of the use of these materials. He went on to discuss the fibers and said the turf comes with a certification that all the fibers are lead-free. He concluded that Notre Dame played on a grass field for 87 years and then decided to go with field turf and this is the same exact product that went in at Notre Dame.

Councilman Camilleri asked about cleats. Mr. DiPiazza said anything you wear on natural grass is acceptable to wear on field turf. He said his personal recommendation was some type of molded cleat. The sign will say no metal cleats, but it's not prohibited. He said he would not allow it at this level. There was further discussion of the use of metal cleats.

Council President Mazzer asked if they were planning to lay the turf in the next two weeks, and Mr. DiPiazza said they were waiting for approval of the markings so

they can manufacture the carpet. He said the production slot was about two weeks away. He added they need to make a final decision on the markings by Friday of this week.

Council President Mazzer asked if weather had an effect on the field, and Mr. DiPiazza said they sew the panels together, they do not use glue. He said you can plow the field and put ambulances on it, you will not rip the field apart. He said at temperatures in the 20s the needles of the industrial sewing machines tend to break, and the fabric becomes rigid – so if it gets really cold they may take a break. He added it would be nice to have a snowfall on it, it settles the material down, but you can use it as soon as they leave the site.

Councilman Camilleri expressed concern about the bleachers from the Girls' Softball field and asked if they would leave a divot on the field. Mr. DiPiazza said they could. He said you definitely have to put something to spread the weight. He suggested  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch plywood and then go over the area with the groomer they provide.

Councilman Cimiluca asked about the color of the end zone. Councilman Camilleri said Mr. Cerullo had suggested putting a Falcon in the opposite corners of the field.

Councilman Cimiluca asked what markings Field Turf was donating, and Mr. DiPiazza addressed that.

Councilman Accomando brought up the concern of the sun, and Mr. DiPiazza explained that the sun reflects from the plastic fibers, but in New Jersey we don't have to worry about the heat. He explained how this effects the field temperature. He said some people introduce water to the field, which can help, but it creates a steam bath. He said it's not worth it. You can still walk out there.

Councilman Camilleri discussed fencing and holes in the field for pitching mounds. Reference marks for the mounds were discussed. Councilman Cimiluca discussed the bases. Mr. DiPiazza said these are weighted bases with cleats on the bottom. He said they could also put marks for the bases.

Mr. DiPiazza mentioned that with regards to the logo, if you're not in a stadium environment you don't see it as clearly. The block letter format is more typically used because it's crystal clear. He suggested keeping it simple for fields like this.

Councilman Camilleri said he definitely wanted to identify the field as Saddle Brook Falcons.

Discussion continued regarding the smaller soccer fields.

Mayor White asked about maintenance required once the field is installed and what is strictly prohibited on the field. Mr. DiPiazza said you don't want things like rodeos and monster truck competitions, but the field is not as delicate as you think it is. He said you should have no reservation about plowing the field and suggested they bring whoever they want to the field once it's complete, and they would go over all the do's and don'ts. He said they have a video that shows you how to plow the field safely, where to park an ambulance and those things. He said what you are buying is the Mercedes Benz system. It's hard to damage it. You would have to get out there with a four-wheel drive jeep or something and spin your wheels like crazy. You don't want to have food introduced. You want to sweep the field after an event. You can have a town picnic on the field, but you don't want food to migrate into the sand and rubber because you can get mold growth afterwards. Soda and Gatorade is fine. When it rains, the field will cleanse freely. There's really nothing else you need to prohibit on the field. Use it.

Mr. DiPiazza explained the groomer that is provided for the field. He said it brushes the fiber and brings the sand and rubber back level. He explained how it was used and said it takes about an hour to do the field, and it should be done once every six weeks during the playing seasons. Some municipalities elect to hire someone to do maintenance, including Field Turf. He said if you have grounds people they can

easily take care of it without it costing any money. He said all the maintenance costs that were in the budget before disappear.

Mr. DiPiazza said they were also getting a sweeper which can be used any time. He said you want to say no to chewing seeds or chewing gum, but the kids will do it anyway. You can clip it with a scissor. He said they will provide signs to attach to the fences that say what is prohibited on the field.

Mayor White asked how much is the service contract. Mr. DiPiazza said typically it's about \$7500 a year. He said feel free to call him at the end of the year and he could tell how well it was being maintained. He said the manual they will give is colorful and crystal clear and tells exactly what to do. If you don't follow it, you will lose a couple years of life off your field. It's minimal. It's an hour once every six weeks. He explained what will happen if the maintenance is neglected.

Discussion of placement of the small soccer fields continued.

Mayor White said it seemed to him there was so much on that field already, if you add more it's going to get confusing. It's already a little confusing. Mr. DiPiazza suggested painting the short soccer fields.

Council President Mazzer asked for a motion to re-open the meeting to the public for questions on the turf field.

Ms. Zottarelli said Mr. Costa had promised there were going to be bathrooms. She wanted to know if there were going to be bathrooms. Mr. Costa said he did not have the check book. He said they came in with a concept and gave it to the previous council, but it's up to this council if they are going to go forward and appropriate the money and go.

Ms. Zottarelli said she thought the money had already been appropriated. Mr. Costa said there were concepts shown to the previous council, and it's a new council. That council did not say go. Ms. Zottarelli asked again if there were going to be bathrooms.

Councilman Camilleri said he was right there with Ms. Zottarelli, and he had that question on his list. He said he wanted to do that part of the project, and it was definitely a necessity. We have to figure out if there's extras, if there's pluses and minuses, and we have to figure out what we have so we can do the bathrooms.

Mr. Larry Ratajczak asked what was the big rush into pushing this. Councilman Camilleri said he did not know, and he wanted to take time. Mr. Ratajczak asked where we were money wise and how much we spent so far. Mr. Costa said \$722,000 is the field as of today. He said the discussion the other night was to take out the temporary fencing which is a savings of \$43,000. There is an additional wall height that is probably around \$15,000 give or take \$12,000 and some additional pavers. Right now you are about \$700,000, and the number for the turf is around \$550,000. So 1.2. Councilman Cimiluca added that \$400 is coming from the County. Mr. Costa said he thought the total bond was \$2.1.

Mr. Costa added to do the snack stand and the bathrooms if you put a budget of half a million dollars you have it. Council President Mazzer agreed. Mr. Costa said last year he was told the town is more than likely going to get additional funds.

Mr. Lo Dico said we have requested it, but they haven't allocated any monies yet.

Mr. Ratajczak asked what we got and Mr. Costa said they haven't appropriated the money. Mr. Ratajczak said he was saying don't rush. What was the rush?

Councilman Camilleri said he had a list of stuff, some for Mr. DiPiazza and some for Mr. Costa.

Council President Mazzer said let's finish the questions from the audience and then we can go back.

Mr. Howard Rofofsky of 520 Victor Street asked if we had the bathrooms funded or would it cost us extra. He said we were told there was money bonded to get the bathrooms done and now he said he was getting a little nervous because that's not what he's hearing. Council President Mazzer said there is money left over. Someone said roughly \$900,000. Mr. Rofofsky asked if that was dedicated to the bathrooms, and Councilman Camilleri said they would make sure it was.

Councilman Camilleri said he wanted this done right. He didn't want to cut a corner or do something cheaply, then you have to come back and do it again. The thing with the bathrooms too is it's got to be done ASAP. He said after speaking with the cheerleaders, that is their main thing, it's their only fund raiser. If that gets off the ground it has to be done September 1 or August 31<sup>st</sup>.

Councilman Cimiluca said the key thing is to make it accessible for the garage and they can have locker rooms.

Mr. Costa explained he had given everyone copies of this concept. He said realistically you have three to four weeks, maybe five weeks to put a set of specs together to get on the street. Two weeks to bid it, three weeks, then you have 60 days to award it. The monies are available, you don't have to bond, so it could move relatively quickly.

Council President Mazzer asked for a motion to close the meeting to the public.

Mr. Costa stated the money from the County was going to expire in December of last year, so if you didn't award and start, the \$400,000 would be off the table. In the same respect, if you went back to the trough, he said he imagined the County would look at you a little bit differently because they gave you for two years \$400,000 that you basically didn't use. That's how, he believed, we got the money in the first place, because there were other communities that didn't use it. That's how Saddle Brook got those kinds of funds.

Mr. Costa said the best thing to do is to call them tomorrow, have the Mayor go there. Mr. Lo Dico said they don't have anything ready yet. Mr. Costa said it was important – have two council people, have the mayor go down there with the township attorney. You need the money and you want to finish. The project is under construction.

Mr. DiPiazza noted the field turf system we are buying is ADA handicapped accessible. Anybody with a wheelchair will go fine over the surface. He said the field system that is being put in has been the subject of numerous long-term safety studies, and if anybody has a question about putting artificial turf in with regards to it not being safe as a grass field, the Field Turf system has been proven through independent five-year studies. These studies are published in the *New England Journal* [of Sports Medicine] to be safer in almost any category of injury than a nicely maintained natural grass field. These tests were done in Texas, so they weren't frozen conditions. It's very impressive and you should have that information

in your file. God forbid there is an injury and someone wants to come after the Township and say, oh, there's turf in there, you did your due diligence. He said Councilman Cimiluca actually did a lot of research into that. The studies are available, you can see them on the website.

Council President Mazzer thanked Mr. DiPiazza and he said this would be ready for them sometime tomorrow.

Councilman Camilleri asked about the backstop for Babe Ruth and mentioned the temporary fencing that sits on top. Mr. Costa said they were going to take out the fencing that was originally designed and get a price on this.

Councilman Cimiluca said one of the fears was having a hundred and fifty holes in the ground.

Councilman Camilleri mentioned extra safety netting along the Girls' Softball field along the roadway. He talked about the Babe Ruth backstop, the football fencing. Mr. Costa discussed pricing for various types of temporary fencing. Storage of the fencing was also discussed. Councilman Camilleri said he thought that was the best solution as he did not want holes in the field.

Councilman Camilleri discussed proceeding with the bathrooms and the concession stand ASAP. Mr. Costa discussed costs of some of the items and said we would have excess money. He said we would have close to \$950,000 and estimated the snack stand, the bathrooms and the little patio area would cost half a million.

Councilman Camilleri said the girls' scoreboard was struck by lightning, and it doesn't work. It needs to be replaced. Mr. Costa said he was told it was just a controller in the board, but if not they would need a new scoreboard.

Mayor White asked if they had seen a conceptual drawing of the bathrooms and the concession stand. Mr. Costa said he could send a .pdf tomorrow, and there were two concepts. He said he would send them to everyone. Discussion of the layout of the bathrooms and a patio continued.

Councilman Camilleri mentioned the far corner and said there was a request from the rec commissioner to turf that as well. Mr. Costa said he would look into it. Councilman Camilleri said his concern was what it would cost because he wanted to put the bathrooms in, and it's all about dollars and cents.

Councilman Cimiluca asked if the temporary moveable bleacher locations were concrete right now. Mr. Costa said not right now. Councilman Camilleri said we have to do something with that. We can't put the bleachers on the grass. It's hard to maintain, and it doesn't look good. Councilman Cimiluca mentioned he thought it was probably dangerous to walk on pavers with cleats. Councilman Camilleri said he thought the grass would actually work. He also mentioned concrete and said he had seen it done where they dye the concrete. He said it was a lot cheaper, and it looks nicer. Councilman Cimiluca asked if Mr. Costa could give numbers for dyed concrete and for turf and for pavers.

Councilman Cimiluca asked about the kitchen in the snack stand. Mr. Costa recommended having the people come to a meeting with the architect. He said if you want this thing done by September you have to fly. Mr. Costa recommended getting an espresso machine and said it would pay for the field.

Councilwoman D'Arminio said we had one. Mr. Costa said it was popular, and it would be a big seller.

Council President Mazzer asked for a recap and Mr. Costa went over items he would research and get back to the Council. Council President Mazzer suggested calling a meeting with whoever needs to be involved in cheerleading.
